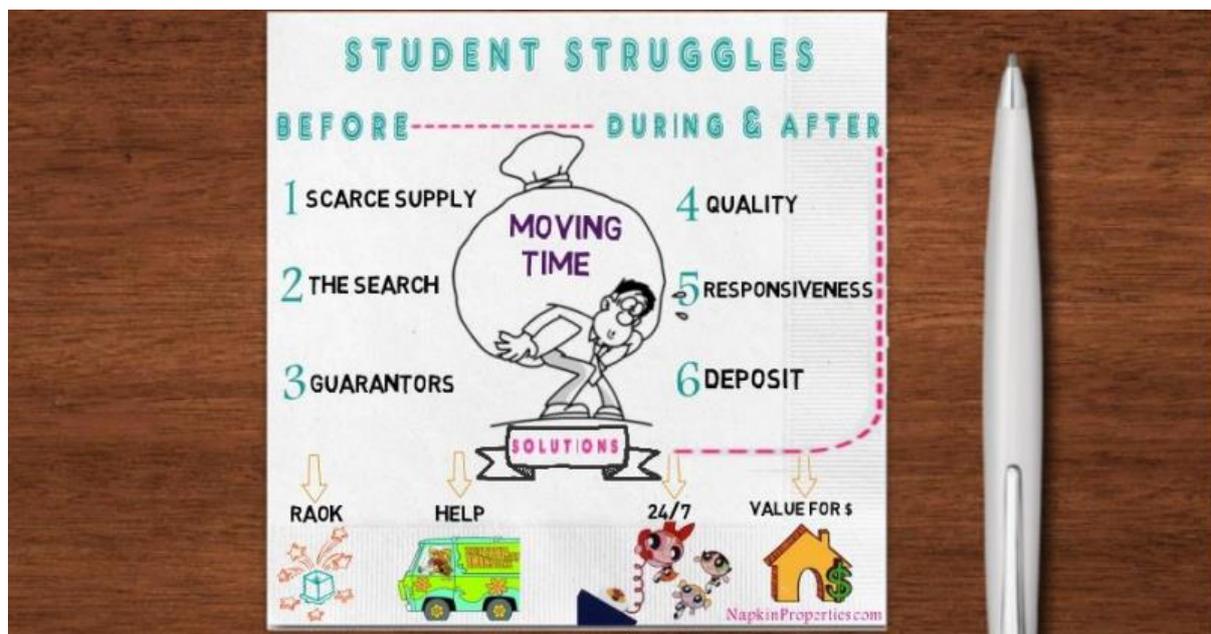

### Application Process

Finally on the 10th of June I found out that I will be joining the company as a part time intern.
